In response to these startling numbers, Asia-Pacific Nazarene **Theological**


Seminary taking a "cutting-edge" step forward in preparing Christlike

> globe at the International Cutting Edge Conference in Wheaton, IL. The conference largely dealt with global churchbased initiatives in holistic childhood development.



APNTS continues to partner with Korean Nazarene University to provide an accelerated English program for students during their semester breaks. A recent group of twentyone eager, energetic, enthusiastic young people arrived on the APNTS campus for six weeks of intensive English study. Along with six credit units of academic classes, they are also paired with current APNTS students for one-on-one tutoring five hours each week. This provides intensive language practice, and even more importantly, deep friendships are formed and life changing encounters happen.

In addition to the classes and tutoring, the students live in Naza-



reth Hall, eat in the dining hall, attend chapel, and are enveloped into the campus community. Faculty members host them to Friday night dinners. Weekends include fellowship in local churches, shopping, and tours to places of interest in the Philippines. One student remarked, "We could study English in Korea, but we could not meet the people and have the experiences we have here." They have returned to a new semester at KNU more changed than they imagined. ©
